## **Director's Notes**

The musical Gypsy is adapted from the autobiography of Gypsy Rose Lee, who moved from a mediocre career in vaudeville to meteoric stardom in burlesque. The story of her childhood and that of her sister, June, revolves around their mother, Rose. She is a woman driven by the conviction that June will one day be a star and, to this end, she creates a vaudeville act to showcase June's talents. Louise (Gypsy) is the ugly duckling who is in the act to make up the numbers.

As vaudeville dies and is replaced by burlesque, Gypsy takes the opportunity to move with the times – much to her mother's dismay – and very soon becomes known throughout the world. What was so special about her? Well, she was no longer an ugly duckling but, more importantly, her act was different from all the others: rather than bump, grind and strip, she teased. It was mainly about engaging the audience in banter. Rose was always dismissive of burlesque, although she had no qualms about living on the proceeds from it until her death. When burlesque reached the end of its days, Gypsy found alternative careers: writing, acting and talk-show hostess.

In this production, we have been lucky enough to find some very talented youngsters to take us through Gypsy's early years and we are also delighted to welcome a number of other new faces to join some of our regular performers.

I hope the Criterion audiences will enjoy this unusual story, made very special by Jule Styne's memorable music and Sondheim's gift for the perfect lyric.


In Clive Francis' adaptation, Graham Greene's classic satirical novel becomes a wonderfully funny and fast-moving romp.
